Paediatric Critical Care Course Level 3 – Intermediate Module

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Course Overview

This course is delivered by The Faculty of Children's Nurse Education in conjunction with the Paediatric Critical Care Society (PCCS) working closely to ensure the module meets the quality standards it sets leading to a nationally recognised qualification in paediatric critical care.

This course will facilitate the development of the practitioners' knowledge and skills in the core elements of paediatric critical care. Practitioners will consolidate their knowledge of anatomy and physiology and the interventions required to care safely for a child and young person requiring L2-3 (PCCS, 2021) critical care, utilising current research/evidence to underpin their practice. The principles of holistic, family centred care will run throughout the module.

The aims are to facilitate the personal and professional development of the Registered Nurse within the speciality of Paediatric Critical Care Nursing. Learning outcomes include developing an analytical and critical approach to the concepts and evidence based practice within paediatric critical care nursing.

The FCNE PCCS Level 3 Course is divided into an Intermediate and Advanced Module. The Intermediate Module focuses on L2-3 critical care and is delivered to PICU, GICU and pHDU nurses. PICU nurses complete the summative assessments for the Intermediate Module.

GICU and pHDU nurses from regional centres also attend the Intermediate Module to enhance their knowledge of L2-3 critically ill children. Students who do not work consistently in a Level 3 Paediatric Critical Care Unit, are not able to complete the assessment.

PICU nurses then go on to complete the Advanced Module focusing on L3 care and gain accreditation through the PCCS.

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Course Information

Pre-Requisites

- Working with L2-3 critically ill children on a regular basis: Paediatric ICU nurses
- Working with critically ill children on an infrequent basis: General ICU nurses

Content

The module content is built upon the student's experience of caring for children and young people in the critical care environment. Topics will include:

- Anatomy and physiology of the major organ systems
- Systematic assessment of the child and young person requiring critical care organ support
- Principles of respiratory, renal and cardiovascular support of the child or young person requiring critical care
- Development of essential skills in the utilisation and analysis of literature to underpin actions and decision making
- Psychological needs of the child, young person and family when faced with critical illness
- Ethical and legal issues when caring for a child or young person in the critical care environment

Aims

- To develop the knowledge and skills of practitioners caring for L2-3 critically ill children, young
 people and their families with a holistic family centred approach
- To develop an understanding of the importance of utilising research and evidence in the care
 of children and young people requiring intensive and critical care
- To ensure practice is based on evidence and incorporates relevant professional, legal and ethical dimensions

Assessed Learning Outcomes: Formal Assessment PICU Nurses only

At the end of the module the learner will be expected to be able to:

- 1. Safely care for a L2-3 paediatric critical care patient with minimal support cues and guidance
- Critically analyse and apply the evidence base to assess, plan and implement safe, holistic, ethically sound, family centred care for children and young people requiring L2-3 critical care
- Contribute to practice developments within the critical care environment to ensure the safe and holistic care of children and young people requiring critical care interventions

NB, PCCS Level 2-3 is equivalent to Advanced Level 1-2 paediatric critical care (PCCS, 2021, Page 12) i.e. the child with single organ failure, on conventional ventilation etc. Your poster content must reflect this level and not the higher acuity L3 PICU patient.
