Paediatric Nephro-Urology 1

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Course Overview

The module is delivered by Faculty of Children's Nurse Education working closely with the Paediatric Nephrology Nurse Group to ensure the module meets the foundation education requirements of nurses and related AHP's working within the paediatric nephro-urology service with minimal knowledge of this speciality, and more experienced practitioners working in other areas that also provide care for these patients.

Module aims are to facilitate the personal and professional development of the course attendee by:

- Ensuring that the practitioner gains an understanding of the anatomy and physiology of the Renal and Urology System.
- Developing knowledge and skills in relation to the:
 - Assessment of a child presenting with a Renal or Urological condition and its management.
 - Continuation of evidence-based nursing care for children diagnosed with a renal or urological condition.
- Demonstrating the multi-professional team approach required for the care of children and their families with a nephro-urology diagnosis.

Content

This module will enable practitioners to develop their existing knowledge and skills in the management of children with a renal or urological diagnosis by increasing their understanding and application of current research and specialised practice.

This course is designed to provide a foundation level of education surrounding the lifelong management and nursing care of patients with altered renal and urological physiology. The course is facilitated by a multi-disciplinary nephrology and urology team, who as well as delivering this education will be able to offer an insight into individual roles and the care they deliver.

Aims

To develop further the specialised knowledge and skills of practitioners in relation to the assessment and management of nephro-urological care for children and their families.

Assessed Learning Outcomes

- 1. Assess, plan, implement and evaluate interventions of nephro-urological care to ensure that it is safe and appropriate.
- 2. Support and empower children and their families utilising professional expertise of self and the multi-disciplinary team, including advising, counselling and psychological support.
- 3. Deliver holistic care which recognises ethical and legal issues.
- 4. Contribute to an environment in which nephro-urological nursing care is developed using an evidence-based philosophy.
